After serving as RCA missionaries in Romania for four years (where you supported and loved us so well!), God



called us to be co-pastors in a rural town of Fairview, Illinois for 5 ½ years. When we were asked to consider serving in Hannover, we felt God calling us to combine our love of cross-cultural hospitality with an opportunity to shepherd His people together within the Reformed tradition.

If you've ever spent time in a culture where your heart language is not used by most people, you might know the joy of finally walking into a worship service where you can praise and worship Christ and share with other Christians in your native language. It's truly a liberating and powerful experience of God's mercy, and one that we hope to provide as the co-pastors of RELISH (Reformed English Language International Service in Hannover). RELISH is a congregation made up of believers from around the world whom God has brought to Hannover and who are more comfortable worshiping in English than in German. In this place, the Revelation 21 church can be glimpsed as Christians across the globe joyfully worship alongside one another.
