
Adult Video Series Begins January 11

Adults will meet in the Family Life Center at 10:40 on Sunday mornings beginning January 11, for a Max Lucado video discussion study of John 3:16, the passage that he calls the "Hope Diamond" of scripture.

Join in this 5-session study where Lucado shares personal stories about his own faith and unpacks God's plan for salvation and victory over sin and death while recognizing the immensity of God's gift to the world.

In this familiar passage of Scripture, the Lord conveys how much he loves you, what he was willing to give to save you, and that there's nothing you can do to earn his salvation.
