“Soup & Pie” and “Soup-er Sunday”

Our annual **Soup & Pie Supper is Sunday, February 1, from 5:00 -7:00 PM.** Invite others to attend with you. Freewill donations will be received for our youth.

“Soup-er Sunday” is February 8. Everyone is invited to bring items for the Exchange food pantry in Lennox and to wear their favorite team jerseys. The consistory will serve a soup lunch following Sunday School classes.

Ash Wednesday Service, February 18

We will hold an **Ash Wednesday service with imposition of ashes and the Lord's Supper on February 18 at 7:00 PM.**

Ash Wednesday begins the season of Lent, the 40 days (excluding Sundays) that lead to Easter. This first day of Lent and the following liturgical season are marked with a somberness as Christians reflect on their mortality, their sinfulness, and the dying of self that comes with new life in Christ.

Ashes are a biblical reminder of our mortality: “You are dust, and to dust you shall return” (Genesis 3:19). The spreading of ashes on foreheads is a visible reminder of this. The ashes also represent sorrow and repentance for sin.

Ash Wednesday reminds us that two things are involved in genuine repentance: “the dying of the old self and the coming to life of the new” (Heidelberg Catechism, question and answer #88).

The way to Easter is the way of the cross. “Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death?” (Romans 6:3).

New life with Christ involves a daily surrendering of the old life. Ash Wednesday, the first step of this Lenten journey, invites us to acknowledge our mortality and our sinfulness by the imposition of ashes.
